Dear HTS Families:

This weekend, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord. This brings to an end the season of Christmas. The Sacrament of Baptism was immediately presented to us when Jesus was baptized in the Jordan. John had been baptizing people and calling them to repentance. He was preparing them for the coming of the Messiah. And then Jesus, the Son of God showed up to be baptized by John. John didn't want to do it at first, but Jesus insisted. So He entered the Jordan and was baptized by John.

Did Jesus need this baptism? Did He need to repent? Obviously not. When Jesus entered the water, He Himself baptized the water. And by entering into the water, He made all water holy and transmitted His grace to it, so that it could, henceforth be used as the instrument of the baptism of others.

One of my favorite things we do here at Holy Trinity, is celebrate the Baptism of every student, staff, and faculty member. Every other month at our all-school Mass, we recognize the Baptismal dates of those who were baptized during those two months, to celebrate the awesome gift we received at our Baptism! Baptism is the doorway through which we enter the life of grace, become members of the Church, and share in the life of the Trinity. Baptism is a loving gift from God that leaves an indelible (permanent) mark on our souls. As the waters of Baptism are poured upon us, we are transformed by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

Always remember, that through your Baptism you belong to God in a very special way! I encourage you to celebrate your Baptism, just like you do your birthday! After all, at your Baptism you were born again into new life with Christ!

Here is the special section, where each week, I will share information about what “Standards-Based Learning and Assessment” means, what it will look like for your child, and why we are making the change.

Why is my child graded using a number scale (1, 2, 3, 4) rather than letter grades?

When students are graded on standards-based learning targets, a number scale is used to identify where they are in the learning process. The following number scale provides a description of what each number means.

Archdiocesan Number Scale (grades K-3)

- 3 Proficient** *Student demonstrates consistent understanding and application of concepts and skills aligned with grade level standards.
*Student can complete assigned tasks independently.
- 2 Developing** *Student demonstrates partial understanding of grade level standards.
*Student can sometimes complete learning activities without assistance.
- 1 Emerging** *Student needs more time to develop understanding of grade level standards.
*Student can complete learning activities with assistance.

Archdiocesan Number Scale (grades 4-8)

- 4 Advanced** *Student demonstrates understanding of concepts and skills extending beyond grade level standards.
*Student can independently complete self-directed studies.
- 3 Proficient** *Student demonstrates consistent understanding and application of concepts and skills aligned with grade level standards.
*Student can complete assigned tasks independently.
- 2 Developing** *Student demonstrates partial understanding of grade level standards.
*Student can sometimes complete learning tasks without assistance.
- 1 Emerging** *Student needs more time to develop understanding of grade level standards.
*Student can complete learning activities with assistance
